#### Universal free school meals

Thursday the 17th January 2019 will be the second census day that the government uses to determine how much funding we will receive in order to pay for the Reception. Year 1 and Year 2 children Universal Infant Free School Meals initiative. The funding is based upon the number of children in Classes N, D and S having a free school meal on two separate dates. If children in N, D or S are absent or if a packed lunch is provided, our funding is affected accordingly, impacting negatively on our overall budget. ## Governing Body Update

It's been a busy few months for the Governors' at Gilmorton. With a really informative and constructive Local Governing Body meeting held on the 30<sup>th</sup> October. The Governing Body spent a considerable amount of time completing a self-evaluation and preparing an action plan for the year ahead, to ensure that all actions over the coming months are focused on the improvement of the school. Governors have also completed a skills audit, to confirm what our core competencies are and to highlight any deficits. These skills are aligned to the Department of Education competency framework, which includes Strategic Leadership, Accountability for educational standards and financial performance, people, structures, compliance and evaluation. We will be focusing on this again at future Local Governing Body Meetings.

We were also given an insight into the new Diocesan Rural Commission conducted earlier this year. The Rural Commission recognises that church schools are seen as an intrinsic part of rural mission and ministry and churches and church schools are working together creating a future. The report demonstrates WAGOLL (what's a good one look like?), suggesting that church schools are places of transformation, inspiration, celebration and welcome for communities. I think you'll agree the Gilmorton school is demonstrating this really well through religious education and learning, which often includes members of the community taking part or being some way involved.

On the 9<sup>th</sup> November, members of the Inspiring Primaries Academy Trust, gathered for a Strategy Planning Review. This gave Headteachers, Governors and Trustees an opportunity to get together and discuss short and long term plans that will benefit the 9 schools within the Trust. It involved discussions and some team challenges to understand 'Where are we now as a Trust?', 'Where do we want to be?' and 'What plans can we put in place to get there?'. It was a good opportunity for all to discuss ideas openly, and the overall feeling is that getting more school staff and parents involved would be beneficial - watch this space!

Aside from this, Governors have been doing their usual school visits, with some visiting to be involved in the Diwali celebrations, some attending Collective Worship & Class Assemblies and others attending the Remembrance Service at the school - which we all agree, have been wonderful opportunities for children to showcase their work and pupils, staff and parents should be really proud of all they have achieved in the autumn term. There are further visits planned for the Spring term to cover academic learning and changes to syllabus, sports funding and SEN, to name a few.

One final note that the Governors would like to add - is to say a Huge Thank You to Mrs Marie Sandford and Mrs Gerry Price. Mrs Sandford & Mrs Price are both celebrating their 25 Years Service in Education. Both have shown enthusiasm and passion within their roles, and I'm sure pupils and parents will join the Governors in thanking them for all their hard work over the years.
