Dear Parents/Carers,

The February half term break is almost upon us. During January all classes have taken part in dental workshops and enjoyed poetry workshops with Ian Bland. The poetry day began with an assembly packed with rhyme, rhythm, fun and interaction with children and teachers. This was followed with poetry writing and performance workshops for each class.



This week Classes F, R, I, E and N have experienced Maths Adventure workshops. By using their expert maths skills they were able to solve the puzzles to find the 'dark codes'. It was close but they managed to crack the code before the Robotrons destroyed our school! It was fantastic to see the children develop their character muscles of resilience, enthusiasm, curiosity and co-operation.

Before we finish for the half-term break on Friday 15<sup>th</sup> February, Class N has a recycling workshop to look forward to and a singing workshop with all children from Year 2 across our trust schools. Class R will undertake a visit to High Cross to gain understanding in how the range of businesses work.

Whether we have visitors in school or participate in trips out of school, we always receive compliments about the children's behaviour, listening skills and understanding.

Classes F, R, I and E have been trialling RE lessons for the diocese and, as a result have made connections with the Mission Aviation Fellowship (MAF). To raise funds for MAF, we will be holding 'project bake off to take off' during the afternoon of March 1<sup>st</sup> details overleaf.

### E-safety

Safer Internet Day is a point in time shared around the world. It is a time to raise awareness of the need to be informed, curious and safe when we are online. As a school we aim to include this message throughout the year and through various curriculum subjects, not just computing.

This year Safer Internet Day was on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> February with the theme 'Together for a better internet'.

### Feedback

We have received a number of comments and suggestions slips this term and would like to take this opportunity to respond:

- One suggestion is to alter the seating arrangements for Class F when we go to church, making better use of the choir stalls. We will liaise with the church wardens in trying to balance seating arrangements so that children can see clearly but also the many parents present can also see to participate.
- We have received a concern about the quality of school cardigans. We will liaise with our uniform provider and also get quotes from other providers.
- Unfortunately we are unable to assist with the suggestion of transport provision for the many children who attend our school from Lutterworth. Leicestershire County Council has a statutory duty to provide transport for in-catchment primary pupils living more than 2 miles from their catchment school but this duty does not apply for pupils who attend from out of catchment through parental choice. We are as concerned as yourselves about the traffic at the beginning and end of the school day and have always recommended using the school buses if eligible, walking if local and car sharing if possible.
- We have received a number of comments about me moving into the CEO role full-time – thank you for the kind comments. Alongside the Trust Board and Local Governing Body, I will be endeavouring to recruit Gilmorton Chandler's next leader.
